• Dean – Clean Water Action Council

- o Gave a small presentation
- o Banning of Coal tar-based pavement sealants
- o Communities are restricting it on public/municipal properties
- o They are trying to get everyone to place a ban on sealants with coal tar-based product

Engineer Updates

- Plans have been approved by the DNR
- As soon as we get the phosphorus, we won't have any more payments to the DNR
- Finalized plans will be this summer
- Cedar will finalize plans and put out for bids (may take several months)
- Building could cost \$335(k) \$355(k) with the cost of building materials
- Looking at a loan with 15% principal forgiveness
- Applications are due September 30th for this grant
- We are over the medium household income for some grants
 - Option #1: Clean Water Fund is a federal program so we must pay federal wages must be certified that the steel was made in the USA (AIS documentation)
 - \$6500 application cost admin cost Bond council

Need Board authorization by our July meeting

- o **Option #2:** Rural Development (not feasible for the cost)
- Option #3: State Trust fund loan; not principal forgiveness, no federal wages & no AIS documentation required
- o **Option #4:** Local Bank for 20 year General Obligation Loan
- Construction schedule completed by September 2023
- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law must meet DOT standards (7:52)

Updates from Bruce

- CMR Resolution 22-01 was issued for the report Troy made a motion to accept the CMR report as written and issue a number, Dennis 2nd all approved, motion carried (7:55)
- Gary Jacobs wants his lawn fixed, he had woodchips but now has ruts
- Carpet needs to be cleaned in the Hall Tim said him and Cindy would replace it with carpet tiles if the cleaning doesn't work, or whenever it needs to be replaced
- Asked SDA to fertilize the ball field
- Got bids for various streets in the Village from the County and Scott Construction (8:05)
- Went through the Village to see how the signs are, some are faded and need replacing
- Vacuum Pump and Compressor came in and replaced the floats
- Crack-fill 1st Street from Church Ave to Old Orchard approx. cost \$7000. Tim made a motion to repair 1st Street and Troy seconded. All approved, motion carried (8:23)
- Replace 3 stop signs, a school sign and get a dead end sign for 2nd street (8:38)
- DeGroot bill was higher than the estimate because the cost of everything went up and they fixed 3 more manholes that weren't listed
- We need to look into getting a camera at the sewer plant. That facility to bring yard waste is only for Village Residents

Land and Water Update:

- **ISOTOPE** testing was done in February with 11 households. The results were given today
 - Water is coming from the subdivision into the village
 - Haven't found the source of where the nitrates are coming from, will continue to search and run more tests
 - o 300 tests will be available for Kewaunee County in November
 - o Phone number will be sent with each sewer bill. Please call and get your free test
- Minutes were approved as presented, Dennis made the motion to accept, with Troy 2nd the motion all approved (9:04 pm)

• Bills were presented, Tim made a motion to approve all Chad 2nd the motion, all approved (9:03 pm)

New Business

- Harter bills have gone up due to the cost of fuel. They are charging us a surcharge since fuel is over \$4 per gallon (per contract)
- Picnic tables at the park need to be fixed and some need to be replaced
- Our August board meeting will be changed to August 16th due to the election!

Old Business

- If it's not toilet paper, it doesn't go down the toilet
- Please do NOT put grease or wipes of any kind down your toilet or drains! Information went out with everyone's sewer bill on what can NOT go down your toilets
