THIS WILL REPLACE THE WORDING CURRENTLY USED IN CHAPTER 9.42 #7

(7) OTHER PARKING IN RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS AREAS. Parking in residential OR business areas, off street and on street, shall be limited to the use of the residents of those homes and businesses. No one is allowed to park your personal vehicles, RV's, trailers, boats or anything else on any road, business or stub road for an extended period of time. Except for short term parking (6 hours or less), the number of vehicles parking on or in front of a residential lot shall not exceed double the number of people residing on the premises and having an automobile driver's license

- a. No parking of vehicles, trailers, motor homes, travel trailers, UTV, ATV, boats or other motorized vehicles except on a hard surface (asphalt, concrete, brick, concrete pavers, gravel driveways or gravel pads, which are maintained and free of ruts, potholes, weeds, grass, and not expanded in area). This hard surface must entirely encompass the width of the wheelbase and the length of the entire undercarriage of the vehicle, trailer, motor home, travel trailer, UTV, ATV, boat or other motorized vehicle involved. Vehicle must be registered and operable.
- b. Parking is allowed in the side and rear yards on a designated hard surface as required in sub. (a), with a minimum setback of 3 feet from the side and rear lot lines.
- c. No parking across the sidewalk. State of Wisconsin statute 346.52 (1)(d) states: "No person may stop or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended and whether temporarily or otherwise, in any of the following places: On sidewalk or sidewalk area, except when parking on the sidewalk or sidewalk area is clearly indicated by official traffic signs or markers.
- d. TRUCK PARKING IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS. No motor vehicle over ton rated capacity bearing a commercial licensed trailer shall be parked or stored in a platted residential district, except when loading, unloading, or rendering a service.
- e. You will be given 72 hours upon notice to move the vehicle in question or will receive a fine. Fines will be determined by the Village Board and can change at any time.
- f. See Chapter 7 (7.04 (1)(b)(c) parking limitations
